He has destroyed several enemy planes.â • Arthur Donahue was an American fighter pilot who volunteered to fly for the British Royal Air Force in World War II. He was killed in action in September 1942. Donahue wrote two books about his RAF service, Tally-Ho! Yankee in a Spitfire (published in 1941) and Last Flight from Singapore (published in 1943).

Author Arthur Donahue follows up his Tally-Ho! Yankee in a Spitfire with an account of his days flying the Hawker Hurricane for the RAF in Singapore just days before it was surrendered to the Japanese. Great read!
